POSTGRADUATE STUDY PROGRAMMES

Master of Arts in:

European Interdisciplinary Studies: The Internal and External Dimensions of the European Union

Organised at the Natolin (Warsaw) campus of the College of Europe, this programme offers students the possibility to analyse the European integration process beyond disciplinary boundaries, and to acquire a deeper knowledge of its aspects. It is designed to respond to the increasing need of experts who have a more comprehensive understanding of the integration process and European affairs, and offers particular insight into the nature of the enlarged Union and into the relationship of the Union with its neighbours in the South and in the East.

EU International Relations and Diplomacy Studies

The programme provides specific knowledge of the European Union as an actor in the international environment, as well as skills in international negotiation and diplomacy. It aims at a comprehensive understanding of the EU's external relations, bringing together an interdisciplinary analysis of its internal decision-making processes with developments in the broader context of international relations and diplomacy.

European Political and Administrative Studies

The programme provides students with a comprehensive understanding of the institutions and major policies of the European Union. It also examines the EU's role at the international, national and regional levels.

European Economic Studies

The programme provides students with an in-depth specialisation in the economics of the European Union and offers a comprehensive coverage of European

economic integration including its process, policies, market functioning, liberalization and regulation. The programme focuses on European public policy, but includes a range of courses which pay explicit attention to the implications for business strategies.

A limited number of students can take part in the ‘**European Law and Economic Analysis**’ Option which focuses on EU Competition Law and Market Regulation.

European Economic Studies Specialisation: European Economic Integration and Business

The programme focuses on the manifold interactions between business and the EU. It combines a solid and high level economic training in the analysis of European integration with an understanding of business and corporate strategy. Students specialise in the EU-business interface. Through business case studies students learn how the European Union affects companies, and how a company or a sector develops a EU strategy vis-à-vis policy makers.

Master of European Law (LL M)

The programme provides students with an in-depth education in European Law. It establishes a balance between the economic and the constitutional aspects of European law, and emphasizes both the increasing complexity of EU law and the context in which it is evolving.

A limited number of students can take part in the ‘**European Law and Economic Analysis**’ Option which focuses on EU Competition Law and Market Regulation.

Each study programme corresponds to a total of 66 credits (ECTS).
