« The people dimension »

- 1. Mobility agenda for EU citizens and for the economy
- 2. Shortage of 12 million in the overall workforce, 16 highly qualified jobs to be filled in 2020
- 3. Integration of services market : 800 regulated professions (25% regulated in a single Member State)
- 4. Beneficiaries of the Single Market: only big business? What about SMEs and professions?
- 5. « Youth on the move »/Bologna process \rightarrow impact on the single market?

Professional Qualifications' Directive and Services Directives

- 1. Professional Qualifications Directive :
 - Directive 2005/36/EC
 - Consolidation, Repeal of 15 previous Directives
- 2. Services Directive
 - Directive 2006/123/EC
 - New instrument, new strategy
- 3. The two Directives complement each other (e.g. temporary mobility, points of single contact, IMI)
- 4. But differences in scope : health professions and jobseekers (free movement of workers)

Modernisation of the Professional Qualifications Directive

- 1. Directive from 2005 but many parts 20 or 30 years old
- 2. Large evaluation with competent authorities and professions already in 2010
- 3. Public consultation: January to March (>350 responses)
- 4. Green Paper July 2011
- 5. Legislative Proposal

Opportunities and

- Access to information, model of the point of single contact (Services Directive)
- Reaping concrete benefits from IMI
 - \rightarrow European professional card
- Member States' policy on regulated professions
- Temporary mobility a key factor for growth

.....and difficult areas

- Concept of competence <u>instead</u> of duration?
- European Qualifications Framework
- Health sector (automatic recognition, patient safety)
- Language skills of a professional, such as a doctor or tourist guide (Article 53 of the Directive)

Conclusion

- 1. « People dimension » untapped potential for the Single Market?
- 2. Professional Qualifications Directive important for services markets
- Modernisation = better integration of professions into the single market (professional card)
