"The College is an exceptional European 'observation post and our presence in Warsaw gives our students the opportunity to comprehend the new Europe, which is being created with the enlargement. It is at the College where a part of the future European elite is trained and it is good that young people can take advantage of a place where one is confronted with such a mix of cultures. One of my concerns will also be to strengthen the links between the two campuses of the College and the communities that surround them, in Bruges and in Warsaw."
