Class 1

1. **The EU Turn to Participation:** An opening lecture combined with major brainstorming about the rationale of participatory democracy in the EU context.

2. **The EU Participatory Tool-box**: Discussion and first-hand simulation of the EU participatory tool-box through the examination of the daily operation of various participatory channels – both institutional (such as ECIs, public consultations, and EP petitions) and unconventional (such as digital campaigning, and astroturfing) – deployed in the EU policy space.

3. **The EU Participatory Project**: Choice and preparation of individual or collective participatory projects consisting of a simulated or real-life participatory experience with the EU (<u>e.g.</u> request for access to document, submission to a public consultation, drafting of a letter of complaint, ECI registration, etc). This project can be related to a cause you deeply care about, your Master's thesis, future research article, blog post or Op-Ed as well as to the benefit of <u>a</u> NGO you'd like to assist. In doing so, you will rely on the how-to-guide developed in "Lobbying for Change: Find Your Voice to Create a Better Society".

4. **The EU Participatory Pitch:** spark talks of 3 minutes for each project, followed by Q&A and debrief from instructor and peers. This final part of the workshops will provide a final debate on the state-of-the-art of EU participatory democracy and wrap-ups.







Article 10

1. The functioning of the Union shall be founded on representative democracy.

2. Citizens are directly represented at Union level in the European Parliament.

Member States are represented in the European Council by their Heads of State or Government and in the Council by their governments, themselves democratically accountable either to their national Parliaments, or to their citizens.

3. Every citizen shall have **the right to participate in the democratic life of the Union**. Decisions shall be taken as openly and as closely as possible to the citizen.

4. Political parties at European level contribute to forming European political awareness and to expressing the will of citizens of the Union.

Citizens take part in the political process through their representatives—the European Parliament and the governments gathering in the Council—

but also directly via a multitude of participatory channels.

a new, experimental and temporary opportunity structure that might enable both institutional actors and citizens to gain an entirely unprecedented, and thus enriching, exposure to transnational, bottom-up preferences. While EU citizens continue to lack effective possibilities to shape EU integration, the launch of the Conference on the Future of Europe marks **the first explicit admission** that **they** – not the Member States or the EU institutions – **are the EU's ultimate source of authority and legitimacy**.

How different from previous attempts at Treaty revision?

1st time since 2007 institutional reform

different from 2003 Convention on the Future of Europe, which drafted the EU's never-ratified constitution Rather than getting entangled in divisive themes, the conference will put substantive policy issues affecting EU citizens at its core.

New logic

Should those issues call for solutions the EU can't offer within its constitutional prerogatives, then treaty change would be driven by citizen demand—not from the top.

What did we learn from COFOE?

(my take)

Possible to establish on an ad hoc basis a **transnational space for deliberation** without which neither its citizens nor elected representatives would be exposed – and pay attention – to the viewpoints that are expressed in other parts of the Union.

What's COFOE's output?

178 recommendations to unbox

Rec-by-Rec Analysis

- Recs not requiring new action (23)
- Recs entailing new action by MS (21)
- Recs entailing new action by EU (113)
- Recs entailing Treaty change (21)

Among the 21 recs requiring Treaty Change, they call for transfer of new competences in:

Welfare (7) Education (5) Institutional reforms (4) Health care (2) Taxation (2) Energy (1)







Figure 6: Complaints to the European Commission and investigations about potential breaches of EU law (2016–2020)




Co-operation tends to work, but what if Commission doesn't act as wished for?

overlooked / unsolved tension









most important, systematic infringements

Tension worsened by

- information asymmetry between the Commission and Parliament in relation to enforcement
- Commission's practice of referring a significant number of petitioners to other bodies at national, regional or local level
- the lack of a binding agreement framing the co-operation between the Commission and the PETI Committee

If the only legal tool is <u>'motion of censure'</u>(Art. 17.8 TEU), other avenues available to reshape the PETI vs Commission










Turnout in European Parliament elections 1979-2014

Team 1 – Accountability for NGENEU

- **NextGenerationEU** is set to entail the largest transfer of EU resources to the Member States.
- You've been contacted by a leading philanthropy to advise on how to advocate for the creation of an ad hoc accountability channel in case of misused of funds.
- What tool(s) would you advise to mobilise?

Team 2 – Pushing Integrity Rules for MEPs

- You belong to a coalition of civil society organizations and grassroots who has been advocating for lobbying reform at the EU level.
- In particular, you're concerned about conflicts of interest situations arising out during (MEPs are free to undertake side jobs) and after (MEPs are free to embark on any job the day after terminating their mandate).
- Given the limited progress attained at the EU level,
- What course of action would you advice? What/which tools?

Team 3 – Reforming CAP asap

- The CAP is not only the costliest EU policy, but also one of the least effective.
- How can you put this reform on the agenda, by asking the EU to reform it BEFORE the due date?
- Is there a dedicate channel to do that?

Team 4 – End LGBTQ-free zones

- You belong to a community of citizens who reside across several selfdeclared LGBTQ-free regions.
- After you have successfully reached out to the EU in order to draw their attention, the Commission opened an infringement proceeding before the CJEU.
- As you and your community are directly affected by these national restrictions, you would like to be part of the case.
- How can you do that? Does the CJEU allow for the submission of Amicus Curiae Brief (like the US Supreme Court of the EChR?

Team 5

- Your Brussels- based human rights organisation advocates for Roma rights in Europe. Although Roma represents the most discriminated individuals in our society, several Member States do regularly adopt and enforce policies whose compatibility with basic human rights is often questioned.
- While the EU Commission is the guardian of the Treaty and in charge of the monitoring of the respect of EU fundamental rights by its MS, it enjoys almost unlimited discretion.
- Despite your constant advocacy, the Commission turns a blind eye and fails to act.
- What can you do to change that?

Team 6 - Misuse of NGEU funds

- Your Member State of origin has already received the first installment of EU funds within Next Gen EU.
- Based on evidence gathered by the media, it appears the public procurement process used to allocate those resources has been tainted by proximity between the government and the winning bidders.
- How can you bring this up to the EU if at all?


