TEACHING METHOD(S)

Lectures and discussions.

ASSESSMENT METHOD AND CRITERIA

Two-hour, open-book, digital, in-class exam (one essay question to be answered from three) will account for 100% of the total mark for the course.

Retake examinations, i.e., exams passed in the second examination session, will have the same format as those taken during the first exam session. No other element of evaluation which would have been taken into consideration in the calculation of the final mark during the first examination session will be considered in the second session.
