COURSE OBJECTIVE

- This course aims to introduce students to basic legal concepts, elementary philosophy of law and the main fields of law.
- To explain different categories of law (e.g. public v private law), the influence of different legal traditions (e.g. common law v civil law) and different sources of law (e.g. international v domestic sources of law), specific attention will be given to methods of legal interpretation and legal reasoning.
- To introduce students to the specific features of the EU Legal Order and its interaction with public international law and the national legal orders of the EU Member States.
- The course aims to prepare those students without prior knowledge of law for the main course of the 1st semester.

COURSE CONTENTS

This course introduces students to basic legal concepts, elementary philosophy of law and the main fields of law. After a brief overview of the different categories of law (e.g. public law vs. private law), the influence of different legal traditions (e.g. common law vs. civil law) and different sources of law (e.g. international vs. domestic sources of law), specific attention is devoted to methods of legal interpretation and legal reasoning. The final part of this introductory course focuses on the specific features of the EU legal order and its interaction with public international law and the national legal orders of the EU Member States. The course is especially designed for students without a prior knowledge of law.
