For US students


The Fulbright-Schuman Programme offers scholarships for American students to obtain a Master's degree in one of the College of Europe's one-year programmes (European political and administrative studies, EU international relations and diplomacy studies, European economic studies, European legal studies and European interdisciplinary studies) at its campus in Bruges, Belgium, or in Natolin (Warsaw), Poland. The College of Europe is a truly multinational institution



where graduates from over 50 countries study and live together. The working lanquages are English and French.

The application deadlines are in October for the grant and in January for admission to the College of Europe (please note that candidates must apply to both institutions separately).

Fulbright-Schuman Chair in US-EU Relations

Every other year (in rotation with the European University Institute in Florence), the Fulbright Schuman Programme funds the Chair in US-EU Relations at the College of Europe. This ten-month fellowship allows the grantee to pursue independent research in the Fall semester. In the Spring semester, he/she will teach a least two courses in the framework of a Master's programme to a very select and international group of post-graduate students. These courses will help



promote the students' understanding of relations between the US and the EU. Grantees may also be asked to advice theses and participate in conferences.

Strong applicants include current professors of EU studies or related academic fields such as political science, international relations, law, economics, and public policy. Candidates are expected to hold a Ph.D. and have several years of teaching experience. French is desirable, but not required. Previous Chairholders include Glenda Rosenthal, John McCormick, Alan Henrikson, Marco Rimanelli, David Cleeton and Amie Kreppel.
