Why did you choose POL?

I chose to study the Master's in European Political and Administrative Studies for three main reasons. Firstly, the College of Europe is known as the best place to study European politics. While a reputation is not everything, it does attract influential names to Bruges. Secondly, the Master's programme is bilingual. As French and English are the two most widespread working languages in the European institutions, it makes sense to start using them interchangeably while studying. Finally, I appreciated the possibility of specialising in the branch of European politics I was most interested in during the second semester.

How do you think your experiences in the Department will help you in the future?

The Politics department has the added value that it allows you to put the knowledge you laboriously accumulate into practice.
