



## Study Track “Interdisciplinary Studies”

### Academic Programme

#### Why follow the Study Track “Interdisciplinary Studies” (Natolin)

Students interested in taking a broader, cross-disciplinary view of transatlantic affairs can pursue their interests by choosing from a wide array of courses at both the College of Europe and The Fletcher School. They will gain expertise in European integration processes, EU external relations and transatlantic affairs and learn to provide imaginative solutions to today’s most pressing and complex national, regional and global challenges by adopting a multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary, contextual and multicultural approach.

#### Students starting at the College of Europe

Students of the MATA programme who choose to join the “Interdisciplinary Studies” track during their studies at the College of Europe will be trained to think beyond disciplinary boundaries and to understand the broader historical, regional and global context of the EU integration process and transatlantic affairs. Multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary training in EU institutions and decision-making, EU law, EU economic governance, European history, geopolitics, technology and politics, energy, religion and politics, migration, policy analysis and cross-cultural communication is provided during the first semester.

In the second semester, students can choose from four Majors to gain in-depth knowledge in EU public affairs and policies, the EU in the world, the EU and its neighbors, or European history and civilization. These studies will then be complemented by coursework on international affairs at The Fletcher School.

#### Semester 1

During their first semester at the College of Europe, MATA students in the study track “Interdisciplinary Studies” who start the MATA programme in Natolin will follow a **compulsory foundation course (4 ECTS)**:

## Semester 2

In their second semester at the College of Europe, MATA students in the track “Interdisciplinary Studies” have the opportunity of specializing in **one of four majors** (EU Public Affairs and Policies; The EU in the World; The EU and its Neighbours; or European History and Civilization). They follow **4 optional specialist courses** (16 ECTS) in their chosen major. Students in the EPAP, EUW and EUN majors may replace one of the optional specialist courses in their major by one optional specialist course in the EHC major. Students in the EHC major select minimum one (1) and maximum two (2) courses from the list of specialist courses available in the EPAP, EUW and EUN majors. These courses are marked with an asterisk (\*).

Students may also follow non-assessed compact seminars (maximum 2) in their chosen major, as well as workshops (maximum 2) and simulation games (maximum 2). They participate in **one of the study trips** organized in the second semester in the EU and its neighbourhood (Study Trip Modules, Coordinator: E. Ośniecka-Tamecka, Professors: G. Mink, T. Schumacher, A. Tyushka, P. Winand, **2 ECTS**, 30h) and, if possible, in a **one-day study trip** to visit major transatlantic stakeholders in Brussels.

They will also continue to follow the joint course entitled “US-EU Relations in the 21st Century: Transatlantic Project” (E. Alessandri & B. Berti, **3 ECTS**, 15h). In the second semester, this course is focused on developing a joint project.

## Option 1:

In the spring, students will hand in their **Master’s thesis** (26 ECTS) on a topic of transatlantic affairs.

## Option 2:

### Semester 3

Students will carry out a **high-level internship** (26 ECTS) related to transatlantic affairs of ideally four months, but at least three months. Students who start the MATA programme at the College of Europe are expected to do their internship in the United States.

### Semester 4

At The Fletcher School, MATA students in the study track “Interdisciplinary Studies” will select 4 courses (6 ECTS and between 26.5h and 32.5h each). They may also cross-register and substitute one of these four courses by a relevant course from Tufts University or Harvard University. Additionally, they may take an extra half course.

In the spring, students will hand in their **Master’s thesis (26 ECTS)** on a topic of transatlantic affairs.

## **Students starting at The Fletcher School**

Students of the MATA programme who choose to spend their first year of studies at The Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy will focus to a larger extent on international relations and slightly less on the European dimension of interdisciplinary studies than those students who begin their studies at the College of Europe.

During the two semesters at The Fletcher School students have to choose at least one course from each of the three divisions (‘breadth requirement’): International Law and Organizations (ILO);



Diplomacy, History and Politics (DHP); and Economics and International Business (EIB). Some courses are particularly recommended, subject to availability during a semester, since they help prepare students for their study programme at the College of Europe.

## Semester 1
