The TOTAL Chair of EU Foreign Policy (Department of EU International Relations and Diplomacy Studies at the College of Europe, Bruges) is organising an international conference to discuss the position of political Islam in Arab Mediterranean societies. The aim of the conference is to explore the changing context in which the European Union implements its foreign policy.

In the aftermath of the Arab revolutions and uprisings, the EU has to deal with new interlocutors, which include important movements and political parties claiming to have an Islamic identity and agenda. Considering the relative neglect of the Islamic dimension in EU foreign policy debates and in academic literature on EU foreign policy, this conference aims to improve the understanding of Islam as a political, social and economic identity and will explore also its moral dimension. The conference will attempt to lay the foundations for a more balanced European approach towards Arab Mediterranean societies and their different tendencies.

The guest speakers are specialists on political Islam as well as practitioners from the Arab Mediterranean countries and the EU. The first session will analyse the relationship between Islam and the Arab Mediterranean political space, paying special attention to the role of Islamic identity, the different trends within political Islam and the socio-economic role of Islamic movements. The following session will focus on the evolving political landscapes of various Arab Mediterranean countries and the last session will discuss the implications of all this for the EU.

The conference reflects the core objectives of the TOTAL Chair of EU Foreign Policy, which are to increase general awareness of the 'societal level' and to integrate an 'outside-in perspective' in the analysis of EU foreign policy. The idea is to provide a counterweight to the predominant Western-centric and state-centric approaches in both the conduct and analysis of EU foreign policy.
